2016 Sardis Governor General's Academic Medal

Lord Dufferin, Canada's third Governor General after Confederation, created the Academic Medals in 1873 to encourage academic excellence across the nation. Over the years, they have become the most prestigious award that students in Canadian schools can receive. They are awarded to the student graduating with the highest average from a high school.



This past summer, it was announced that **Samir Rehmtulla** was awarded the Governor General Award for Sardis Secondary as the top academic graduating student of 2016. On February 23rd, Samir was presented this prestigious award at Sardis Secondary. NATIONAL MEDAL IN THE 2017 SCHOLASTIC ART & WRITING AWARD

We are pleased to announce that **Jun Hwan Kim** has earned a National Medal in the 2017 Scholastic Art & Writing Award, presented by the Alliance of Young Artists and Writers. His submission of 'Flash Fiction' titled *Reality Check*, was selected by creative professionals as the most accomplished in this United States national competition. This year more than 330,000 works of art and writing were submitted. Less than 1% were recognized at the national level. Students receiving top awards have been invited to attend a ceremony at the world-famous Carnegie Hall on June 8 to participate in showcase events at Parson's School for Design at New School and Pratt Institute's Pratt Manhattan

Gallery in New York City. We are very proud to have Jun Hwan Kim represent Sardis Secondary in this year's Scholastic Art and Writing Award!

TREE PLANTING

This large-scale, multi-year project started in 2013 from Vedder River campground and moved westward down the left bank of the Vedder River. The main purpose of the project was to restore groundwater and surface flows along the floodplain by using controlled intakes to create off-channel habitats. These re-watering efforts were to provide off-channel rearing and overwintering habitat that the salmonid species rely on. These habitats offer refuge during storm events, provide habitat complexity suitable for all stages of life and overall watershed stability.

Fraser Valley Watersheds Coalition (FVWC) has been a partner in this project along with many others since 2013. Special thanks goes to volunteer groups like the SSS group (Ecomaniacs and Community Club with Interact Rotary) for putting in many volunteer hours to replant the area with native trees and shrubs.



This is the SSS group (Ecomaniacs and Community Club with Interact Rotary) that planted 480 native trees and shrubs on the Browne Creek trail next to Yarrow Elementary or at the end of Wilson Road. This was done in cooperation with the Fraser Valley Watersheds Coalition and the Green Team from Sardis Elementary.



TRAVEL TO GERMANY MARCH BREAK 2018!

Again next year we have the exciting opportunity of participating in the biannual exchange with Neuburg in Germany. We will be hosting students from Neuburg for their February Break, and then we will be taking a group of students to Germany for our March break.



Neuburg an der Donau is a picturesque renaissance town directly on the Danube, about half way between Munich and Nurnberg. We will be exploring the immediate area around Neuburg, and we will also go on day-trips to such places as Munich, Nurnberg, and Ulm. An overnight trip to Berlin is also planned. On the weekends students are free to participate in activities with their host families.

Students who want to participate must also be willing

to host a German student in the spring of 2018. This keeps our costs down as well as reducing the German group's costs. As hosts we will be facilitating their visit to Fraser Valley sights and attractions. Students will be matched according to gender, age and interests. While in Germany, students will be under the house rules of their host families, and all school rules also apply for the duration of the trip.
