Activity 5: Pride Stories Activity

In this exercise we can reflect on experiences we are proud of and identify the skills that were used to achieve our success. Parents and students can take turns sharing a story. The same worksheet can be used for up to three people or stories.

Instructions:

- This exercise requires two partners: one to tell a story and the other to listen and complete the checklist.
- The storyteller will recount a time from their life that makes them feel proud. They can share an experience from the past that was positive, something that makes them feel energized as they recall it.
 - Examples include: building a house, coaching a team, organizing a fundraiser event, running a business, to solving a difficult problem.
- Once the storyteller has finished the story, the listener will go through each of the skills clusters to identify whether the storyteller used these skills during the experience that was shared.
 - o They can check the same skill more than once if that skill reoccurs in the story.
 - o If a skill isn't listed, they can add it to the appropriate cluster.
- This exercise allows students to reflect on the skills they have already and learn about skills clusters so they can explore future pathways related to these areas.



OTHERS' SKILLS ANALYSIS

The checklist is divided into clusters of similar skills. As you listen to another person's pride story, check each skill that you heard being used in the story. You can check the same skill more than once if it reoccurs in the story. If a skill isn't listed in the checklist, you can add it to the appropriate cluster.
