<u>Impact</u>

Staff chose items that we wanted to tweak, add or delete from our School Growth Plan, creating some focus goals for the year. From there we developed tasks or events to focus on in order to meet those smaller goals.

First 90 days...

The first 90 days focused on making Sardis 'less institutional, sad and dreary' and 'student sense of belonging'. Small things included cleaning up the front of the school, preparing the track and bleacher area for our Rick Klassen Field dedication, adding vinyl signs that included Halqemeylem on the cafeteria and library doors, wrapping our vending machines with school logos and having staff be more visible to students upon entering the school and classrooms.

Throughout the year we included things like opening the curtains and skylights in the multi-purpose area and beautifying the front and side of the school with new plants and shrubs. October saw us focus on staff mental health and well-being which also involved taking a staff meeting to recharge, reconnect and renew.

Second 90 days and beyond ...

The second and third 90 days focused on the areas of communication and collective responsibility. We focused on student and staff well-being, working together to implement the new reporting order, focus on consistent messaging of expectations (recognition with student coffee cards or lunch hour detentions!), Weekly E-News for staff, Morning meetings for EAs to collaborate and come together as a community, and some time on a pro-D day to go to the river, enjoy the outdoors and spend time outside of the building to just be, share and talk, as people felt led!

As the year progressed, our focusses overlapped and spilled into different areas of the strategic plan and happened at different times throughout. In general it was a great opportunity to target our efforts as we continued to "Meet the Challenge" "xwche'm:est te sti'met" as a community.
