Provincial Assessments and Graduation Status

In order to graduate, students must complete a minimum of 80 credits in grades 10, 11 or 12 courses; some courses are required and some are electives (see chart). In addition, **every student graduating must complete Provincial Assessments: Numeracy 10, Literacy 10 and Literacy 12.** Most students did the first 2 in grade 10 or 11 and students will write the Literacy 12 Assessment this year, as well as any other assessments they missed. The four opportunities to write or re-write these assessments are in November, January, April and June. **You cannot graduate without these required assessments**. See your Counsellor or Vice Principal to register if you missed a grade 10 assessment. Students in the French Immersion program are also required to write the Fral 12 exam in June. See Mr. Hawkenson for more information. If you have questions about your graduation status, please see your counsellor.

Career Life Connections 12 (CLC) 4 credits

All students must complete CLC 12 in order to graduate.

A final mark will be given for CLC and will appear on your report card and transcript.

Students will complete a number of assignments that will demonstrate their Self Awareness, Ability to work with others, Collaboration and Communication, Career Knowledge and Career Awareness. Students will be given a rubric for how their mark (%) will be earned and a meeting with the CLC Teacher will be completed as the final activity for CLC.

By the end of Term 3, students who have not completed CLC 12 will be removed from the graduation list and will not be able to attend graduation activities until CLC requirements have been met.

Grad Portraits

Grad portraits are separate from the regular school pictures and will be taken by a professional photographer in the Drama room at Sardis Secondary. Book an appointment for portrait sittings in December (at *www.signupgenius.com/go/sardis_2023grad_ photo_signup.*) The link will be on the SSS website. Grad portraits are on display at commencement, the grad composite and in the yearbook. All students must get a free photo taken even if they do not want to purchase a portrait package. Retakes will be taken in the Spring.

Grad Information Meetings

Important information will be provided at Grad Information Meetings held on specific dates during Flex. As well, information and input (survey, grad forms, etc) will be required by Grads through their school district e-mail. This gives Grads the opportunity to have input into the Prom theme (colors, flowers, etc.), and selecting a class Valedictorian. It is important to have your voice heard because this is your Graduation! Make sure you attend the **Grad Info Meetings**.

Scholarships and Post-Secondary Information Nights

Unlock Your Future– The Key to Scholarships – Tuesday, September 26th 6:30-8:00 PM An online information session about how to access bursaries and scholarships, providing parents and students with information about the process of applying for money to assist with postsecondary costs. Brittany Palmer will be doing a virtual presentation on **Tuesday, September 26th from 6:30 – 8:00 pm** for all parents and students interested.

Post Secondary School Information Session Night – Wednesday, October 25th 6:00 PM At SSS on **Wednesday, October 25th at 6:00 pm** is another evening presentation for parents to learn how to assist their children in navigating careers and post-secondary. This evening will host representatives from several post-secondary institutions from around BC. The format will include presentations and a gallery of information tables.

Scholarship and Bursary Applications

Information for applying for bursaries and scholarships will be available in the late fall. Students are encouraged to apply for as many as they can. It is important to pay attention to the due dates as applications cannot be accepted past the due dates. Organizations want to give money away to deserving students, BUT you must apply. You can start the process earlier by gathering 2-3 reference letters. All scholarships, bursaries and awards will be formally presented at the Awards, Bursaries and Scholarships Evening. See Mrs. Christenson if you have questions or if you need support.

Post-Secondary Application and PSI Choices Form

The Ministry of Education will send your transcripts for free (up to 25) to a post-secondary institution (PSI) of your choice once final marks are complete in June. To direct the sending of your transcripts, you must complete a form online at *www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca.* Complete this form in September and choose up to 25 institutions you are interested in attending.

Students should start applying to Post Secondary Institutions in September. Check to see the application dates for the programs and institutions that interest you, as they may differ and you

want to apply as soon as you can. Immediately after applying to PSIs, release your transcripts online to the universities (any that you think you may want to attend) at *www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca.*

Graduation Events

Auction, Cruise, Commencement, Banquet & Dance, Dry Grad Expectations

At grad events, school administration has a responsibility to ensure that all guests in attendance will conduct themselves appropriately, be respectful to all other graduates and guests, and comply with requests/follow direction from school staff.

- All guests to the Grad Cruise, Prom and Dry Grad must be a secondary student (gr. 10-12) from the Chilliwack School District
- All guests to the Grad Cruise, Prom and Dry Grad will be required to have a character reference from an SD#33 school principal or vice-principal (Guest Approval forms are available at the office)
- For all formal grad functions, transportation will be provided by the School District, and students must use the provided transportation departing from SSS
- At the end of Term 3, you MUST be in a position to complete the course requirements necessary to graduate by June 2024. If you are not in a position to graduate, you are NOT eligible to participate in the Commencement ceremonies, Grad Prom, and Dry Grad.

NOTE: All school rules apply and these events are free of drugs and alcohol. Students who come to these events **suspected to be, or under the influence of, or in possession of drugs or alcohol will not be admitted**. If it becomes apparent that a student is under the influence, he/she will be directed to leave. There will be no refunds.

Grad Auction

The Grad Auction is an evening of delicious food and wonderful items available for bidding on **Thursday, February 22 beginning at 5:00 pm**. Historically, the Grad Auction has been an opportunity to bring the Sardis community together to raise funds for both the grads and the Grad Legacy Fund. Please encourage your friends, family members and members of the community to attend. Tickets for the dinner are very reasonable for the meal provided!

Grade 12 students are asked to bring in business and community donations in the form of product or gift certificates prior to the event. 50% of the value of the auctioned donation will go directly into the student's grad account. The remainder of the funds raised goes towards reducing graduation event costs and supporting student scholarships for our Grad Legacy Fund.

Grad Cruise

The Grad Cruise will take place on **Thursday, April 25th**. The cruise takes guests from near the Vancouver Convention Centre around Stanley Park to False Creek. A meal, dessert and all you can drink soda is included in the cost. The boat has several decks, a DJ and a dance floor. The busses depart from SSS at 4:30 and the cruise is from 7:00-10:00 pm.

Commencement Ceremony

Grad Commencement is a formal ceremony held at the Chilliwack Coliseum on **Thursday**, **June 13**, **2024 starting at 6:00 pm**. Students should arrive around 5:00 pm**. Students must meet back stage by 5:30 pm to line up in the processional!**

Grads should come to the ceremony already dressed in the grad gown with dress clothes underneath and they should wear shoes that can easily navigate the stairs in dim lit settings. Gowns must be worn throughout the ceremony. Students keep their gowns, hats and stoles.

If Grads want to take pictures at the coliseum, arrive early and take the pictures with family and friends before the ceremony.

Student and audience behavior is expected to be consistent with a formal ceremony of this type. (no noise makers, socializing during ceremony, leaving for pictures or visiting, etc.) Inappropriate behavior diminishes the quality of the ceremony for everyone.

Students must remain in their seats in gown and cap once commencement starts, and remain until the processional leaves at the end of the ceremony.

Grad Gowns

Grad Gown packages are distributed in the PIT on Tuesday, June 11th at 2:45 pm.

Commencement Rehearsal

The commencement rehearsal is on **Thursday, June 13th from 9:00-11:00 am** at the Chilliwack Coliseum (the morning of Commencement).

Grads will report to their first class for attendance and then they will board the busses at 8:45 am which will take them to and from the coliseum. Grads are not to drive their own vehicles to the Coliseum. No exceptions! Afterwards, Grads will be bussed back to SSS for lunch (provided) and then they are dismissed for the day. There will be no afternoon classes for grade 12s.

Commencement Information Form

This form will be completed in the Grad Information Meeting in January. It is also available on the school website. This form indicates the correct spelling of your name, your graduation gown size and a brief statement that will be read as you cross the stage. Hand the form into the office once completed by **the end of January**.

Commencement Tickets

Graduates will receive 4 free tickets for commencement. Tickets are picked up from the office **starting June 5th**. Up to four additional tickets may be requested via email between **February 1**– **April 30**. After April 30th, you will be put on the waitlist and distribution will be limited to availability. Additional tickets cost \$7 per ticket and payment must be made at the time of pickup. All guests must have a ticket to be admitted to commencement.

Graduation Fee

The Graduation fee of \$100.00 covers the cost of Commencement including the grad gown, cap, tassel, stole, memento 5x7 grad photo, diploma, facility rental and decorations.

Grad Banquet and Dance (Prom)

Prom is a formal event at the Clarion Hotel on **Wednesday, June 26th from 5:00-10:30 pm.** At this event, students dress up and spend a memorable evening together. There is a gournet buffet dinner and dessert, an Ice-Cream Bar, a brief formal program and then Grads dance the night away. Students purchase tickets online between **April 1 - May 31.** To reserve a table (seating for 10 per table), you go online and submit your names. Prom tickets are picked up at the same time as commencement tickets in the office.

Community Dry Grad

Dry Grad is following the Banquet and Dance on **Wednesday, June 26th from 11:00 pm to 5:00 am** at the Landing Leisure Centre. Once the Banquet and Dance is over, the night is just beginning! There are plenty of fun things to do including casino games, prizes, character artists, games, music, inflatables, and non-stop food and drinks. Grads should wear comfortable clothing and shoes as this is an activity packed event. Tickets available online from **April 1 – May 31.**

Guest Application for Grad Events

Grads **may apply** to bring a guest to grad events (Grad Cruise, Grad Banquet and Dance, Dry Grad) however, the number of guests depends on space available. These are school events, and therefore the school reserves the right to deny guest applications. **All guests must be a secondary student (gr. 10-12) from the Chilliwack School District and will require a character reference from an SD#33 school principal or vice-principal.** Guest applications will be available online beginning in April 2024. Guest applications for prom must be returned by the beginning of June.

Grad Information Meetings
