Family Affordability Fund

•\$20 per student

•We are only able to use this for school supplies, fieldtrip and other fees charged to parents, clothing and footwear for school sports and other activities. We use it on a case by case basis

•We provide this to families by way of gift cards (WalMart or Superstore) or bus passes

Feeding Futures School Program

•Our cafeteria program is now supplying the food for our students who come to school hungry or need lunch. Now available via students' student card in the cafeteria lineup

•We have breakfast items available from the Fast and Fresh cart

•Counsellors also provide snacks and protein drinks throughout the day

•Numerous teachers provide snacks from their room

FOCUS

•We use a FOCUS day schedule for Career classes, school wide activities/presentations or to offer extra instructional time for support

•No need for students to signup. They either stay in their period 1 class (for careers), travel to their period 2 class (for assemblies/presentations) or attend their regular period class for support

•Staff and students have now been trained in using the FLEX app for weekly signup of classes. We have already been in full swing of this.

•FOCUS block typically occurs every Wednesday from 9:37am to 10:41am.
