DO I NEED VOLUNTEER OR WORK EXPERIENCE HOURS TO GRADUATE?

- YES, ALL STUDENTS REQUIRE 30 HOURS OF PAID WORK OR VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE, SOMETIME BETWEEN GRADE 10 AND 12.
- YOU WILL BE ASKED TO VERIFY THESE HOURS IN GRADE 12.
- VOLUNTEER HOURS ARE ALSO BENEFICIAL WHEN IT COMES TIME TO APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES.

CAN I TAKE HONOURS & AP COURSES?

- YES, BUT WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU SPEAK TO YOUR PREVIOUS MATH OR SCIENCE TEACHER AND SEE IF THEY RECOMMEND THIS FOR YOU.
- BIOLOGY 11 HONOURS IS A DIFFERENT COURSE THAN BIO11 - MAKE SURE YOU READ THE DESCRIPTIONS!
- SOME UNIVERSITIES WILL ONLY ACCEPT THE HIGHER COURSE MARK OF THE GRADE 12 SCIENCE OR AP SCIENCE.
 - EX: PH 12 AND AP PH 12 - DO YOUR RESEARCH!




